



Dear Neighbourhood Watch supporter

The Parish Council has asked us to help make villagers aware of a recent spate of vandalism at the Meon Hall, and at the bus shelter on the A32 at the turning into the village, and to ask anyone who might have information about who might be responsible to come forward.

The incidents are :

1. Between midday Friday 13 and midday Saturday 14 October, the wooden bus shelter had several wooden planks kicked out on its south wall. There is a risk to the public now from bare screws and broken wood.
2. There have been 3 incidents of glass bottle throwing behind the games wall on the Recreation Ground:

The first two times were in mid July and early September, and considered at the time to be isolated incidents.

Then most recently, between Sunday 15 October and Monday 16 October, there was further glass bottle throwing behind the wall. It is estimated that up to 5 bottles may have been thrown against the wall with shards of broken glass ricocheting outwards over a wide radius up to 3 to 4 yards, causing serious danger to people, children and dogs walking in the area. (It is possibly the bottles were from an overflow from the bottle bank bins, and the City Council have agreed to provide an extra bin which should arrive shortly).

James Morrice is co-ordinating the reporting of the incidents on behalf of the Parish Council.
